



Guidelines for writing a guest post on www.iletc.com.au

Thank you for agreeing to write a guest post for our website. Here are some guidelines to assist you:

- Write on any topic related to development or use of learning spaces in schools. Topics can include, but are not limited to:
 - Your experiences in designing, refurbishing or inhabiting learning spaces.
 - Results of evaluations or action research of learning spaces.
 - Insights from teachers, designers or school leaders on the process of developing new spaces, changes in teaching practice or student responses.
 - Your research. If you have recently published or presented research in this field you can adapt this material for the post and link to full text articles, papers or ppt slides. Please feel free to also hyperlink to work you reference or cite in the post.
 - Report on an event such as a workshop, conference or school visit related to learning spaces and/or teacher practices.
- Use non-academic language and avoid jargon or technical language. We have an international, cross disciplinary audience including teachers, designers, researchers, graduate students, businesses and government departments.
- Please limit your post to less than 600 words.
- Include photos or diagrams you have permission to use and include attribution if appropriate.
- Add your contact details to be included, eg. Your email, twitter account, etc.
- Send in word format. A final proof will be sent if there are significant edits to your post.
