What does this do?

Curated Site Tours are organised visits to other institutions that have innovative learning spaces. Visiting other sites allows educators to observe and examine how different institutions utilise and maximise the offerings of their learning spaces. These site tours may be organised by schools, districts, or professional organisations.

How can it help?

Participating in curated site tours provides educators with the opportunity to see how other schools and institutions are currently using innovative learning environments. The site tours also help educators understand how best to implement strategies for using different spaces well and solutions to learning space challenges. It can also provide a chance for educators to reflect and generate ideas on how to improve their own teaching practices. Educators must remember that what works well for one school may not work as well in their own context. Any innovative strategies or practices must be adapted to their own unique pedagogical context.

An example in practice

Bayanami Public School in Australia organises curated site tours for their educators. This enables them to see innovative learning environments in 'working mode.'
